Community Vulnerability Scorecard

Created by students at Georgetown's Conflict Resolution Program, this scorecard is meant to be used by The Sentinel Project to assess a community's vulnerability to violence or atrocities committed by state or non-state actors. Each indicator should be scored from 0 to 1. While this is generalizable, some indicators may be different depending on specific contexts. This scorecard is meant to determine how vulnerable a community is to violence or atrocities, not whether or not it will be targeted.

	Harassment includes offensive, belittling, threatening, or otherwise unwelcome behavior directed at individuals or the group.

	At any point in time has the potential perpetrator had historical claims to the contested resources?			
	Contested resources are resources that are the subject of contention between multiple groups.			
	Resources include land, water, minerals, oil.			
Violence against women	Has there been an increase in the number of recorded incidents of violent acts against women over the past six months compared to the previous six months?	Y=1 / N=0		
	Violent acts include physical bodily harm.			
Ideology	Do groups have competing, strong, or exclusionary ideologies related to politics, religion, etc.?	Y=1 / N=0		
	Ideology is defined as a set of more or less systematic ideas that identify a constituency, the objectives pursued on behalf of that group, and a program of action.			
Ethnicity	Is ethnicity a salient cleavage in the region?	Y=1 / N=0		
	Ethnicity is defined as a grouping of people who identify with each other on the basis of shared attributes that distinguish them from other groups such as a common set of traditions, ancestry, language, history, society, culture.

	Scapegoating includes when a group uses an unrelated event as a rationale to attack or target the group.		
	Sources used to identify instances of scapegoating include: content analysis of speeches, media, newspapers, "official" social media.		
Percent change in official government statements that denigrate the vulnerable group	Percent change in official government statements that denigrate the vulnerable group over the past six months compared to the preceding six months.		
	Statements that constitute denigrating includes hate speech, expressing prejudice toward, inciting violence, threats of violence, use of stereotypes, use of offensive slurs, exclusionary policies.		
	Official statements include press releases, public statements made by government officials or spokespersons, and official social media accounts.		
Percent change in statements made by informal leadership that denigrate the vulnerable group	Percent change in statements made by informal leadership that denigrate the vulnerable group over the past six months compared to the preceding six months.		
	Statements that constitute denigrating includes hate speech, expressing prejudice toward, inciting violence, threats of violence, use of stereotypes, use of offensive slurs, exclusionary policies.

Other Potential Indicators to Consider:

Prevalence of misinformation and disinformation: The Sentinel Project's research on misinformation and disinformation should be considered as a potential source of assessing community vulnerability. More misinformation or disinformation may contribute to increased vulnerability.

Amount of support from external backers: External backers who support a given community (for example, a diaspora) may help decrease the community's vulnerability however perpetrators may also rely on support from external backers to amass the resources necessary to carry out atrocities.

Recent regime change: New regimes may be more friendly to vulnerable groups than previous regimes or the opposite may be true and the new regime may have used negative information about a vulnerable group as part of their campaign.

Recent internet shutdown by the state: The state may use the internet to surveil vulnerable groups or it may shut down the internet to prevent vulnerable groups from sharing information.

Level of internet: Similar to internet shutdowns, throttling the internet or blocking specific apps are ways of controlling vulnerable groups.

Changes in the amount of people gathering in public spaces: Changes in amount of people present in public spaces over the evaluation period. Public spaces include markets, on streets, public transportation, at water collection points, etc. Scored: Increase=1, Stayed the same=0, Decrease=1.
